

**NOTICE OF 30-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD AND PUBLIC HEARING ON  
JOHNSON COUNTY'S  
PROPOSED 2018 ACTION PLAN  
FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) and  
HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS (HOME) PROGRAMS**

On September 21, 2017 the Johnson County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) is scheduled to set September 22, 2017 through October 25, 2017 as the public comment period and October 26, 2017 as the Public Hearing date on Johnson County's proposed Action Plan for 2018. The Public Hearing will be held during the 9:30 a.m. BOCC meeting in the Hearing Room on the third floor of the County Administration Building, 111 South Cherry Street, Olathe, Kansas. The purpose of the 30-day public comment period and the Public Hearing is to receive comments from citizens on the proposed uses of the 2018 CDBG and HOME program funding. All comments will be included in the final 2018 Action Plan prior to submitting the Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
