Scramx

- Transdermal Alcohol Testing.
- There are no photos or manual breathalyzers.
- Can monitor curfew and schedules.



Remote Breath Unit

- Breath Alcohol Testing.
- Provides photo verification.
- *Can be used in conjunction with Gryphex RF or GPS.*
- Utilizes client's cell phone via text to alert when a test needs to be submitted.
- Automated Facial Recognition
- Gives GPS point location where each test is taken or missed.



Gryphex-RF/GPS

- Can monitor just for curfew/RF.
- Can be set for GPS tracking.
- Can locate client within seconds in either function.
- Can be used with or without the typical House Arrest schedule.
- Capability to retroactively investigate client whereabouts at later dates regardless of function.



ReliAlert GPS w/ Secure Cuff

- GPS Tracking
- Offers steel cuff making tampering/removal more difficult
- Ability to send high frequency alert to get Client's attention.
- Ability to call through the bracelet to speak with Client.
- Reserved for high profile, high risk, certain sex offenders, and those with tampering history.

House Arrest involves a philosophy of strictly limiting a client's movements through the use of electronic monitoring.

House Arrest is available to all courts – both municipal and district levels.

House Arrest clients are charged a daily fee to cover the costs of the monitoring equipment. Payments are accepted in the form of money orders or credit cards/online payments.

House Arrest clients are subject to random urinalysis and breathanalysis testing.

House Arrest clients report weekly to meet with their House Arrest Officer, or as directed unless ordered to an "only" program.

House Arrest minor violations can be handled internally. Major House Arrest violations are submitted to the courts in the appropriate format.

House Arrest clients must have an active cell phone or landline. Clients must have electricity in their residence for completing House Arrest and "only" programs as the equipment has to be charged.

Juvenile Note: Once a client has been ordered to the House Arrest Program by a Judge of the District Court, an appointment must be made before a client will be released from JDC. The client will be released 30 minutes prior to the schedule appointment from JDC to the Parents/Guardians. The client **MUST** report to the Youth and Family Services Center to be placed on House Arrest immediately following release.

Adult Note: Clients serving 10 days or less are required to pay fees up front at intake. Clients with outstanding balances owed to Community Corrections may be denied until payment arrangements are made (applies to municipal, sanction, and bond cases).
