CHIP 2017-2019 Update	<p>Chronic Disease Prevention</p> <p>Smoking Cessation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DHE working on a Cessation Action Team to have better screenings and programs to help those who quit, stay quit. Focusing on pregnant mothers and have a diaper reward program and boosting Quitline referrals.</li> <li>Working to deter teen vaping by presenting and educating on vaping and the Juul product in particular.</li> <li>Working with health navigators and behavioral health on healthy living. Injecting physical fitness and mental health to help reduce stress and drive success.</li> </ul> <p>Food Policy Council</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Working on putting together issue briefs.</li> <li>Hunger free healthcare summit in September to get healthy food to the food insecure.</li> <li>Local food production – backyard gardening, working with homes associations to add to bylaws.</li> <li>Partnering with library systems to host “Wasted” viewings, a documentary on food waste reduction.</li> <li>Harvest with your Friends – involve community on reducing food waste through various programming.</li> <li>Save the Food Campaign – PSAs, radio spots, posters – focusing on consumers and food waste.</li> </ul> <p>Physical Fitness/Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assisted in developing Olathe Active app to help navigate local parks and trails.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Biking and walking planning education – connecting routes, making it safe for pedestrians and cyclists.</li> <li>• Diabetes Prevention Program (DPP)– taking out to groups of employees – healthy eating, physical fitness.</li> <li>• Working to get the message out to the deaf community about DPP.</li> </ul> <p>Access to Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Advanced dental practice legislation did not go anywhere this year.</li> <li>• School based oral health services has 32 hygienists who have volunteered. Scheduled at various schools through February.</li> <li>• Community health worker initiative – gathering a listing of community health workers in JOCO to assess where the resources are and where the gaps are.</li> </ul> <p>Mental Health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• No report at this time.</li> </ul>
<p>Current CHA Update</p>	<p>Current Community Health Assessment actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Had 99 volunteers to go into the community to administer surveys.</li> <li>• 368 surveys completed.</li> <li>• Passed out a resident survey for viewing.</li> <li>• Key Informant Survey had been distributed via email – mayors, heads of community organizations, etc. to see what perceptions they have.</li> <li>• Data has been collected and will be analyzed for presentation within the next couple of months.</li> </ul>
<p>Trauma Informed Care and Resiliency – Ave Stokes, Alive and Well KC</p>	<p>Alive and Well KC is a continuation of the Resilient KC grant so the work could continue St. Louis and KCMO collaboration, working on bringing in Lee's Summit.</p> <p>Made up of ambassadors on behalf of church, family, organizations, vendors or individuals. Anyone who wants to be involved. There are 22 committee members. Committee has been formed from the ambassador's group. Housed at JCMH in Mission, KS. Meets every third Monday.</p> <p>November 9<sup>th</sup> retreat to activate communities to heal – Missouri model. Trauma aware, trauma sensitive, trauma responsive, trauma informed</p> <p>Trauma, child abuse and neglect series to be presented in January.</p> <p>Working heavily in St. Louis schools. Working with probation and parole offices</p> <p>Looking for more ambassadors and visitors are always welcomed. B Mitchell will send info out to the group on what it is to be an ambassador, how you can be involved, along with contact information.</p>
