Update on CHIP Progress/Reporting	<p>Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continued support of the Olathe Get Active app. The app will link to the trail system and existing fitness apps. You can sign up for activities, physical and health challenges while collecting badges to earn prizes. Learning opportunities are available through videos on healthy eating. • Steps with Pets program pairing people with dogs at the Merriam SPCA who need to be walked. Everyone gets extra steps. • The Bike/Pedestrian Committee at MARC is completing the regional bike plan. The plan should be ready by spring 2018. • Website for residents to find smoke-free properties has been launched. • Brief tobacco Intervention training has been completed by a local periodontal group. 174 health professionals have taken this training. • Finished distribution of Quitline materials. • Kudos to the Mental Health Center for their support of tobacco-free clients. • Three sites in JOCO have gone tobacco-free. • Partnered with Olathe's Westview Elementary school for healthy cooking classes. • Hunger Summits with a food insecurity focus have been occurring, next one is Oct. 30th. • The Food Policy Council is wrapping up strategic planning process. • The Hunger Free Healthcare Summit at Kauffman was very successful. <p>Access to Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An inventory of community health workers in JOCO is being completed and discussions about possible funding sources are taking place. • The Access to Care group is having a guest speaker attend the next meeting to talk about dental health. • Oral Health – there have been 20 screenings with 6,813 children screened.
