Update Progress Reporting	<p><b>Tobacco</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Multi-unit housing policies / smoke free living initiative is going well. Website is up and running.</li> <li>Paint cleaning products etc. are being delivered to apt. complexes to encourage them to purchase from the HHW store and as a thank you for agreeing to have smoke free policies.</li> <li>Lenexa FD saw website and wanted a brochure about putting policies in place to share with property managers talking about fire dangers associated with smoking.</li> <li>B. Mitchell to email about KanCare cessation progress and counseling changes. Self-identifying clients w/ mental health issues/affordability for people trying to quit now eligible for two free weeks cessation medications.</li> <li>Tobacco intervention training- 308 providers have been through the program.</li> <li>E-cig education symposium in schools with devices to display.</li> <li>KDHE applying for grant to further info on e-cigs.</li> <li>Shawnee looking to restrict the number of e-cig suppliers in the community.</li> <li>30 percent of the state covered by T21 legislation.</li> <li>Vape shops appealing policy in Topeka, judge sided with the store owners, now going to the State Supreme Court.</li> </ul>

**Food Policy Council**

- Issue briefs on priority issues for the next year. Areas of concentration Healthcare, food insecurity in Johnson County, food waste solutions, local food production in Johnson County and cost associated.

**Access to Care**

- Build presence with community health workers.
- Oral Health – working on 25 schools, building list of hygienists and will reach out to school nurses shortly after school is back in session.

**Mental Health**

- Suicide Prevention/screening for anxiety and depression. Want to work with clinics to see how many are also doing to screenings.
- What are the next steps after identifying, making a resource card to hand out during Community Health Assessment for anyone who answers that they need behavioral health help
- Suicide Prevention Coalition #BeThe1To campaign. Learn how to help by knowing the five action steps for someone who is considering suicide:
  1. Ask
  2. Keep them safe
  3. Be there
  4. Help them connect
  5. Follow up

Also provides resources, tips and messages throughout National Suicide Prevention Month

- Mental Health First Aid: August 1<sup>st</sup> at Shawnee Mission Hospital
- Drug takebacks brochure with locations and times was created and distributed.
- Looking into data on how many who have attempted or completed suicide and had been to healthcare providers recently and what the providers are doing to help.
- New app called “Not Okay” for people struggling. Sends auto message to five people preselected in your phone to let them know that you are not okay and they should check on you.

<p>The Next CHA- Update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Need volunteers for the Community Health Assessment, looking 150 people in teams of two to conduct seven interviews per team.</li> <li>• Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> – 200-225 interviews, will use paper only.</li> <li>• Handed out final drafts of the assessment for viewing, much shorter than last time.</li> </ul> <p>Sent survey to stakeholders – Key Informant Survey, also handed out for viewing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Top interests ranked – Resources, access. Housing, finances</li> </ul> <p>Elizabeth Holzschuh presented video and power point</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You Tube video presented – A Tale of Two Zip Codes, social determinants of health inequality.</li> <li>• Hosted listening sessions – Center of Grace and other vulnerable populations.</li> <li>• Nine year difference in life expectancies between the different cities in Johnson County.</li> <li>• In some areas one out of two people are living in poverty.</li> <li>• Gained feedback on stressors that hold people back.</li> </ul>
