Update on CHIP Progress	<p>Chronic Disease Prevention and Health Promotion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Supporting existing programming by partnering with Under Armour and Parks and Recs to develop an Olathe Get Active app. The app will link to the trail system and existing fitness apps. You can sign up for activities, physical and health challenges while collecting badges to earn prizes. Learning opportunities are available through videos on healthy eating. 1,500 walkers participated in Walk KS this year. Working with Roseland Elementary School to make walking to school safer. Smoke-Free Housing – Assessed Johnson County housing complexes and learned that policies are more often in place only in affluent areas. Created a website where landlords can go to obtain easy to follow information on how to put policies in place, or tenants can go to find lists of smoke-free housing. Tobacco 21 working towards ordinances with Shawnee County in Topeka. JCDHE providing cooking classes for Shawnee Police Dept. and Parks and Recs to teach healthy eating and also providing kid friendly recipes. Met with Olathe Schools to identify nutritional /mental health/physical activity needs and will provide tailored programming. Hunger Summits are being held the 1st Tuesday of the month at JCDHE in the Debby Sullivan Room. Starting discussions about less sugars and sweets in the food pantries and various feeding agencies. Food Policy Council has been working for one year now and are wrapping up the strategic plan. Working on food waste source reduction with grocery stores, county buildings. <p>Access to Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Oral Health -Increased the number of dental hygienist from 3 to 27. Integrated Health – approach services all under one roof or streamline referral process? Found what services were being used and then looked at awareness. Discussed what a countywide campaign

	<p>might look like and how to focus and target organizations. Resource connections/streamlining services/bringing in different perspectives throughout the region.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Health Equity – how community health workers can be best utilized. <p>Mental Health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Suicide Prevention Program – eight faith based organizations met to discuss the issue of suicide and what resources are available. • Cerner hosted event w/ 35 different topics highlights to opioid abuse. Very well attended. Will host another event next May with 600-700 attendees expected. • Partnering with MARC on opioid abuse awareness campaign. • JOCO Mental Health Center held a workshop at Balls Conf. Center on the opioid issue in Johnson County. Over 150 participants. • Mother and Child Healthcare Coalition presented a forum on trauma informed businesses. • One of the strategies is to expand knowledge and skills to employers to promote mental health awareness and resources, the workgroup is working on how this can be accomplished. • A list of places to return unwanted prescription drugs is being completed. The listing will be on the jocogov.org website. The goal is to increase number of locations for drop off (hospitals, pharmacies). • School nurses are now allowed to administer Narcan in the event of an overdose. • Discussion about insurance gaps, pre-existing conditions. Suggestion is to continue to contact your legislators to advocate for health insurance coverage.
