**New health clinic hours start June 10**

JOHNSON COUNTY, KAN. (June 4, 2019) – The Johnson County Department of Health and Environment’s (JCDHE) health clinics in Mission and Olathe will offer new walk-in service hours for clients starting June 10.

Walk-in services (immunizations, STD testing and treatment, pregnancy tests, physicals, tuberculosis tests) will be available at the following times:

**Olathe Clinic (11875 S. Sunset Drive)** — Monday and Tuesday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Wednesday, 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.; Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (Immunizations and Prenatal Appointments Only); and Friday, 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

**Mission Clinic (6000 Lamar Ave.)** — Tuesday and Thursday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The new schedule allows for more walk-in services at both locations and allows more appointment times for clients who receive prenatal services from JCDHE. “By adding additional hours to our clinic schedule, we are able to provide clients with a wider variety of services in a central location and increase the number of people we serve which will lead to a healthier community,” says Deputy Director Mary Beverly.
