Hep B Research Project – Kevin Kovach	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Kevin Kovach, JCDHE Epidemiologist presented information on the HepB immunization birth dose. Presentation will be available on the JCDHE website under Community Health Assessment. • Kevin requested volunteers for a task force to continue work on this issue. Logical place for this task force is with the Access to Care work group. • Kevin will pursue task force participation.
Kansas City Regional Health Assessment Report Discussion of the REACH– Dean Katerndahl, Pattie Mansur	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dean Katerndahl presented the Kansas City Regional Health Assessment Report. The link to the report is http://reachhealth.org/goals/regionalhealthreport/ • Highlights: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - population is up 12% percent, poverty up 75 % - 1/4 are uninsured - 13% increase since 2008 - obesity and diabetes rates increase in all 11 counties between 2004-09 - clear correlation between socioeconomic and health outcomes and levels - poverty is suburbanizing - 26.5% of the population is non-white - since 2008 medically underserved has increased by 72,000 - there has been a decline in employer sponsored health insurance • Discussion/comment about the report.
Report on Community Health Improvement Plan Activities -Nutrition/Physical Activity -Access to Care -Mental Health/Substance Abuse	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nutrition: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Report on Food Day activities that will happen on Oct. 24th – 4,500 apples will be given away in several events around the metro area. - WIC Garden was very successful – hundreds of pounds of fresh foods were given to WIC clients. - Faith community will come together at a UCS event in November. It is an opportunity for this work group to address with them the issue of the distribution fresh foods within their ministries. - SCORE campaign was piloted in five of seven sports venues. - Ray Makalous reported that the Giving Grove is planting trees at Crosslines. • Physical Activity <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Thirty schools participated in the Walk to School Day event. Bentwood Elementary School was highlighted this year. They have applied for a grant from Sunflower Foundation for walking trails.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to Care <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Marcia Manter reported on the oral health partnership (Oral Health Kansas and JCDHE) for improving oral health for the senior population. • Mental Health/Substance Abuse <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Jamie Katz and Kimberly Herndon reported that the work is continuing on the strategic framework for the work group. - The next meeting is on Nov. 7th - The Mental Health First Aid class for youth has been given to sixty Shawnee Mission School District principals. - The Shawnee Mission Education Foundation has partnered with this work group on an application to the Healthcare Foundation for increased mental health awareness initiatives with in the Shawnee Mission School District. - Shelby Rebeck reported that five nurses from SMSD went to a Johnson & Johnson symposium with this issue – their thought was that mental health issues are siloed – they hope to share the template with other districts if funded from the Healthcare Foundation. - Mental Health awareness observances are being sent to all Johnson County employees via email.
