Welcome and Introductions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Attendees were welcomed and introduced themselves.
<p>Report on Community Health Improvement Plan Activities:</p> <p>Nutrition/Physical Activity Access to Care</p> <p>Mental Health/Substance Abuse</p>	<p><u>Physical Activity</u> – Nicole Brown reported for the work group.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Walking School Bus is going well. Attended an Adopt-A-School luncheon at Bentwood Elementary in Olathe about partnering to begin a walking school bus. Overland Trail and Corinth walkability checklists are complete. Result was more police presence by the roundabouts to calm traffic (Overland Trail) and some movement to get a sidewalk where there is a walking trail (Corinth). There are several bike to school events coming up. The city of Gardner held a forum on walkable communities – looking at city level policies. <p><u>Nutrition</u> – Renee Bryant reported for the work group.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2012 planning grant for access to healthy foods from the Kansas Health Foundation included completing a residents survey and a faith-based survey – results were shared. Partnering with Johnson County Parks and Recreation District on implementing healthy food options at concessions (two sites). We are moving toward establishing a concessions policy at JCPRD. Will find out in June if funding has been granted to us to work on healthy concessions in schools. The initial planting for the WIC Community Garden is May 10th. WIC clients will be the recipients of the garden produce. Working with the seven largest child care centers in Johnson County to survey them about food regulations and if they can implement additional policies on healthy eating for kids. <p><u>Access to Care</u> – Cindy Galemore and Elisa Storbeck reported for the work group.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Letters were sent to 47 dental professionals to partner with us to offer dental services to school children – four hygienists and 1 dentist are participating. The Health Partnership Clinic is providing this service; they have been to 26 schools. A calibration class has been offered – 8 people are attending – total of 23 have attended this class. Promotion of My RC (My Resource Connection) – met with hospitals and clinics to promote this resource. Discussion on KanCare. <p><u>Mental Health/Substance Abuse</u> – Megan Clark and Kimberly Herndon reported for the work group.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continued promotion of Mental Health First Aid class. So far there have been 300 participants. Valorie Carson has presented at two meetings about trauma informed care. The RPC is receiving funding from KDADS that can fund strategic planning processes with community coalitions. July 1st there will be \$10,000 available for community initiatives. A more concrete plan will be

<p>Sharing, Announcements</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Barbara Mitchell – JCDHE is working toward accreditation; the plan is to complete the application by the fall. Nora Brown – Offers case management to individuals on asset development, stabilization of families and communities, financial, credit, budget, etc. through the Family Conservancy. Melody Kinnamon – the Library offers research on health topics; resources. There will be a health literacy event in October. Tanya Honderick – KU Med Center works with community partners to place student interns, there are students and projects available. Eldonna Chesnut – School inspections are being completed by JCDHE’s Child Care Licensing Division. There are 20,000 children in out of home care. David Thompson – representing the Dept. of Children and Families. Cindy Galemore – At the Olathe Schools there is a bond issue for a fifth high school, an elementary school, IT, safety and security of aging facilities coming up. There is more information on the Olathe Schools website. She is involved in the Latino Coalition, assigned to the Health and Education Task Force. One of four children are on free or reduced lunch. The District is switching to electronic medical records. There are a growing number of people electing to not get vaccinations for their children. Donna Missimer – At the Blue Valley School District, they recently did a bond issue. They are working on dental issues with their students. She is interested in the Mental Health First Aid class for the district nurses. Shelby Rebeck – There is a new superintendent at the Shawnee Mission School District. The National Association of School Nurses is working with the Regional Research Network to establish pods of data. Kevin Kovach – doing a qualitative study of Hep B birth dose; looking at attitudes and behaviors. Irene – El Centro – offers financial literacy, health navigation, etc. services to the Latino population. Leslie Mackey– Shawnee Mission Medical Center – develops and oversees health and wellness initiatives. SMMC has hired a chef to create healthier meals. Kimberly Herndon– Making a Difference classes are available; the program is usually held in schools. Please call her if interested in setting up a class. Erin Gribbin and Nicole Brown– anyone interested in getting a walking school bus started, please let them know. Renee Bryant– The Food Policy Coalition has offered institutional awards for local food purchasing “24 Carrot Program”. Mike Jensen– Olathe Medical Center has been working on healthier options at their cafeteria. OMC also completed a health assessment that resulted in the same three priorities as CHAP. Great attendance at today’s meeting. Arthur Smith– Marillac and Mercy and Truth both have new CEOs. Started prenatal clinic at Mercy and Truth’s KCK location. Megan Clark– Regional Prevention Center is focusing on the strategic planning project mentioned earlier. April 27th is the Take Back Medication event. Nichole Burnett– the K State Extension Office is offering summer programs on nutrition, how to prepare

New program, 12345 Fitastic is being released; all organizations are invited to participate. • Shari Tedford– JCDHE provides internship opportunities. Next workshop is April 26th. June 7th is the School Nurse Workshop. Partnering with KPHA on the Healthy Homes course. Planning a master trainers Kansas Optimizing Health Program. Submitted a grant to the Health Care Foundation of Greater Kansas City for health literacy. • Holly Sobelman– Gardner has gotten involved with the dental initiative. There is a new elementary school this year, new middle school next year. • Valorie Carson– the United Community Services Summit is June 18th. • Danielle McNaught – MedAct is working to become a Heart Safe community, is looking for a hospital to work with them. By August, they are looking to teach CPR in the schools, possibly implement it into freshman orientation. • Holly Frye – Kansas Department of Health and Environment is preparing for the Youth Tobacco Survey for next fall. Also reviewing CDRR grant applications.
