**JCDHE offers walk-in hours for first doses at COVID-19 vaccination site**

**(JOHNSON COUNTY, Kansas – April 20)** Johnson County Department of Health and Environment (JCDHE) is offering an easier way for eligible people to get their first dose COVID-19 vaccination.

People who are age 16 and older and either live or work in Johnson County can **walk in** this week during the dates and times listed below, **without an appointment**, to receive this life-saving vaccine.

- 4 – 6:30 p.m., Wednesday, April 21
- 9 a.m. – 6:30 p.m., Thursday, April 22

The vaccination clinic is located at 15500 W. 108<sup>th</sup> St., Lenexa.

You should bring a photo ID and a printed and signed copy of the vaccine consent [form](#). Children age 16 or 17 must have a parent accompany them to the appointment and sign the consent [form](#). For those who do not have access to a printer, consent forms are available at the clinic.
