<p>Update/Progress Reporting on CHIP initiatives</p>	<p>Chronic Disease Prevention</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Continued work with landlords on smoke free housing options. Identified landlords interested in policies that include smoke-free indoor areas – 16 have implemented the policy. 334 providers have taken the free online training on how to talk to your patients about tobacco in less than three minutes - Brief Tobacco Intervention Online Training -.can be found at www.KSTobaccoIntervention.org KS Tobacco Quitline now offers two weeks of free nicotine replacement therapy and seven calls with a trained quit coach. Healthy KC Coalition - Tobacco 21 has 13 jurisdictions in Johnson County who have implemented the ordinance. <p>Food Policy Council</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> On-going program planning around the issue of food insecurity. Screenings of the film “Wasted” are being shown in partnership with the library. Training staff at hospitals to ask questions regarding food insecurity in hopes of getting info into the Electronic Medical Record. <p>Physical Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Partnered with Overland Park to plan bike routes and walkability. Worked with partners to build an app called Olathe Active. The app shows different trail maps and amenities in Johnson County and allows you to register for different programming. Looking to have the ability to participate in challenges and use the app to track activity. <p>Access to Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Over 8,000 students had dental screenings at schools in 2018. Will continue to watch legislation around the advance practice hygienists. The Bridge Care program from AdventHealth Shawnee Mission (previously Shawnee Mission Medical Center) and Johnson County Mental Health Center are hosting a community collaboration for front-line workers in the Johnson County area. Staff from Bridge Care had a creative idea about bringing workers together for learning, information sharing, and networking. Working independently to meet the needs of the individuals in our community is hard work, but by collectively sharing expertise and learning from each other, greater impact and success can be attained.

	<p>A front-line worker event is being planned. The first gathering is Thursday, January 31, 2019, from 8:30 to 10:00 a.m. at the Johnson County Arts & Heritage Center, 8788 Metcalf Avenue, Overland Park, KS 66212. A light breakfast will be served. This is an excellent opportunity to bring front-line workers from different agencies together to discuss services provided and learn more about resources that exist within our community.</p> <p>Mental Health</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Continue to work to assist the Johnson County Suicide Prevention Coalition with their initiatives. ● Depression screenings in hospitals and pediatricians offices are already in place. ● April and October national Take Back drugs days promoted. ● 20 Mental Health First Aid trainings completed in 2018. Looking for more instructors for 2019. ● Grant written and obtained for opioid response training. Grant runs December - August <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ CDC media campaign will be promoted ○ New campaign will be written on monitoring and locking up medications ○ Medication assisted treatment trainings for community members to help reduce stigma
