# Priority 1: Access to Care

- Access to care is a national and local priority.
  - Healthy People 2020
  - Healthy Kansans 2020
- Health consequences from a lack of access to care include:
  - Little to no preventive care to diagnose and treat illness early.
  - Poor comprehensive care for chronic conditions.
  - Limited services and education surrounding different illnesses.



# Priority 2: Increased Access to Physical Activity and Nutrition

- Increased Access to Physical Activity and Nutrition are national and local priorities.
  - Healthy People 2020
  - Healthy Kansans 2020
- Long-term health impacts of poor physical activity and nutrition include: diabetes, obesity, and many more conditions.



# Priority 3: Management of Transitions of Care

- Both The Joint Commission (TJC) and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) consider care transitions a leading problem in Health care.
- 80% of serious medical errors are caused by poor transitions.
- Transitions are defined as movement of patient between providers and care settings as patient health changes.
